

COVID-19 arrangements for opening of school to children in Nursery, Reception and Year One classes also children who are vulnerable and the children of key workers.

Staff will refer to social distancing as the child's 'bubble', explaining that in order to keep safe they need to respect their own and everyone else's personal bubble. If an adult, calls out the word, "bubble", it means that they are too close to another person and need to move away.

Expectations regarding social distancing to be shared with the children throughout their time in school and displayed as posters in the classroom.

Parents (and children) must remember to follow the arrows/sign to come into and leave school safely.

Staff and children must clean hands throughout the day, especially:

- when you arrive at school
- before and after eating
- after going to the toilet
- after playtimes and outside activities
- after sneezing or coughing
- before leaving school

Children will be reminded:

- not to touch their mouth, eyes and nose
- that they must stay in their bubble
- they must listen to adults and follow their instructions
- about, 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' (Catch your cough or sneeze in a tissue)
- that if they feel poorly they must tell one of their teachers
- to only touch the things in your tray
- to stay at the activity until your teacher asks you to stop
- to keep safe in your class area at playtimes
- to respect your bubble and the bubble of others
- that there should only be one person at a time in the toilets

It is particularly important at this time to be aware that disruptive behaviour can be symptoms of stress or anxiety and additional support may be needed for some children. Staff can access this support through the Deputy Headteacher, Mrs. Burraway.

Commendation assemblies are not possible at this time, however children will continue to receive praise and recognition for living our values, demonstrating a Growth Mindset or for having Marvellous Manners via communication with their Class Teachers.
